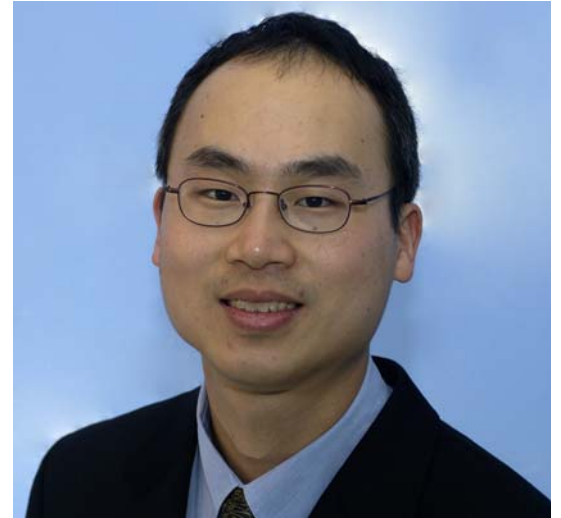
Dr. Lee particularly enjoys spending time educating his patients so that they can better understand and be active participants in their own health issues.
